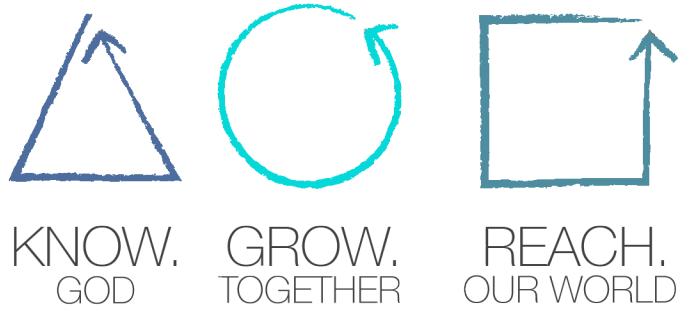

Bible Study:

Re-Reading of Ephesians 6:9 - [9] Masters, but as bondservants of Christ, doing the will of God from the heart, [7] rendering service with a good will as to the Lord and not to man, [8] knowing that whatever good anyone does, this he will receive back from the Lord, and stop your threatening, knowing that he who is both their Master and yours is in heaven, and that there is no partiality with him.
